SUMMARY OF SECRETARY'S REPORT TO THE DSMA COMMITTEE COVERING ACTIVITIES DURING THE PERIOD 25 APR - 17 OCT 23

During this 6-month period, the DSMA secretariat received 50 inquiries and requests for DSMA Notice advice, an increase over the previous period (37) but still below the 10-year average (79). Seventeen requests were initiated by members of the UK media, 17 by Government officials and 16 by members of the public.

<u>National Cyber Security Centre (NCSC)</u>. The Committee visited the NCSC in mid September, the first time it had done so since the NCSC's formation in October 2016.

<u>Counter Terrorism Policing (CTP)</u>. The Committee considered the updated proposal to incorporate CTP into the DSMA Notice system. The Media-Side of the Committee agreed to meet separately to discuss the matter in greater depth and develop a way ahead.

<u>Diversity & Inclusivity</u>. The Committee was presented with the findings of a recent, voluntary, anonymous survey to determine the Diversity & Inclusivity characteristics of committee members. The survey was to be used as a base line for future reference.
